Content description

Within the framework of nation states, it was (and continues to be) the state itself which traditionally provided for the normativity of legal texts through its institutionalised participation in the process of creation and enforcement of laws and regulations. However, on a global scale today, new emerging legal norms (e.g., lex mercatoria, lex digitalis, lex sportiva) seem not to possess equivalent political or institutional support. They are rather closely related to global social and economic processes, from which they also receive their main impetus. But, how then does normativity arise under conditions of globalisation? Asked differently, how does the progression of globalisation change the conditions of the concept of normativity itself? The IP will, in the year 2013, contribute to the analysis of the empirical and normative foundations of global laws’ emergence and canonisation. Under the general topic “canonisation of global law” the following questions shall be addressed: How exactly does global law emerge? Which are the new border-crossing subjects of global law? And last but not least what are the possible grounds of global laws’ legitimation?
